

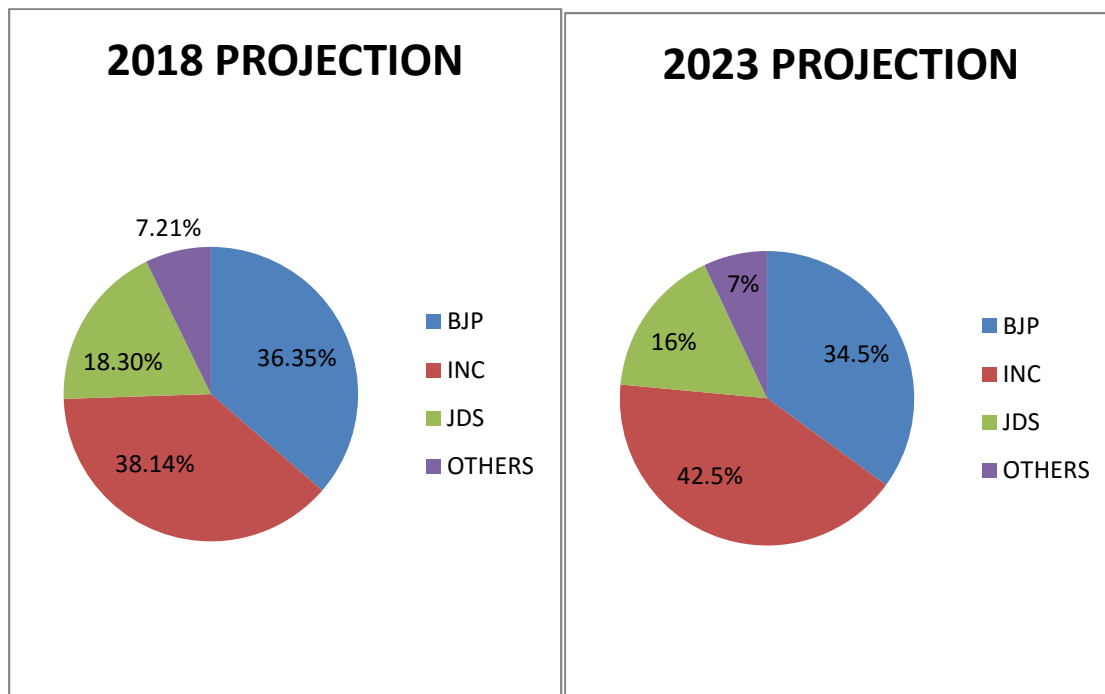

2. MODI'S POPULARITY AND CLEAN IMAGE
3. THE MAN WHO WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR BJP'S DEVELOPMENT IN KARNATAKA IS B.S. YEDIYURAPPA LATER SHOVED OUT OF THE CM'S CHAIR BECAUSE OF INTERNAL PARTY STRIFE. THIS CREATES SOME DISSATISFACTION AMONG LINGAYAT COMMUNITY AND THE LINGAYATS TREATED THAT BJP HUMILIATED LINGAYAT LEADER SRI. B.S. YEDIYURAPPA. B.S. YEDIYURAPPA EX- CM IS A MASS LEADER AND MAXIMUM SUPPORT FROM LINGAYAT COMMUNITY AND FROM YOUTH. BUT MR.
